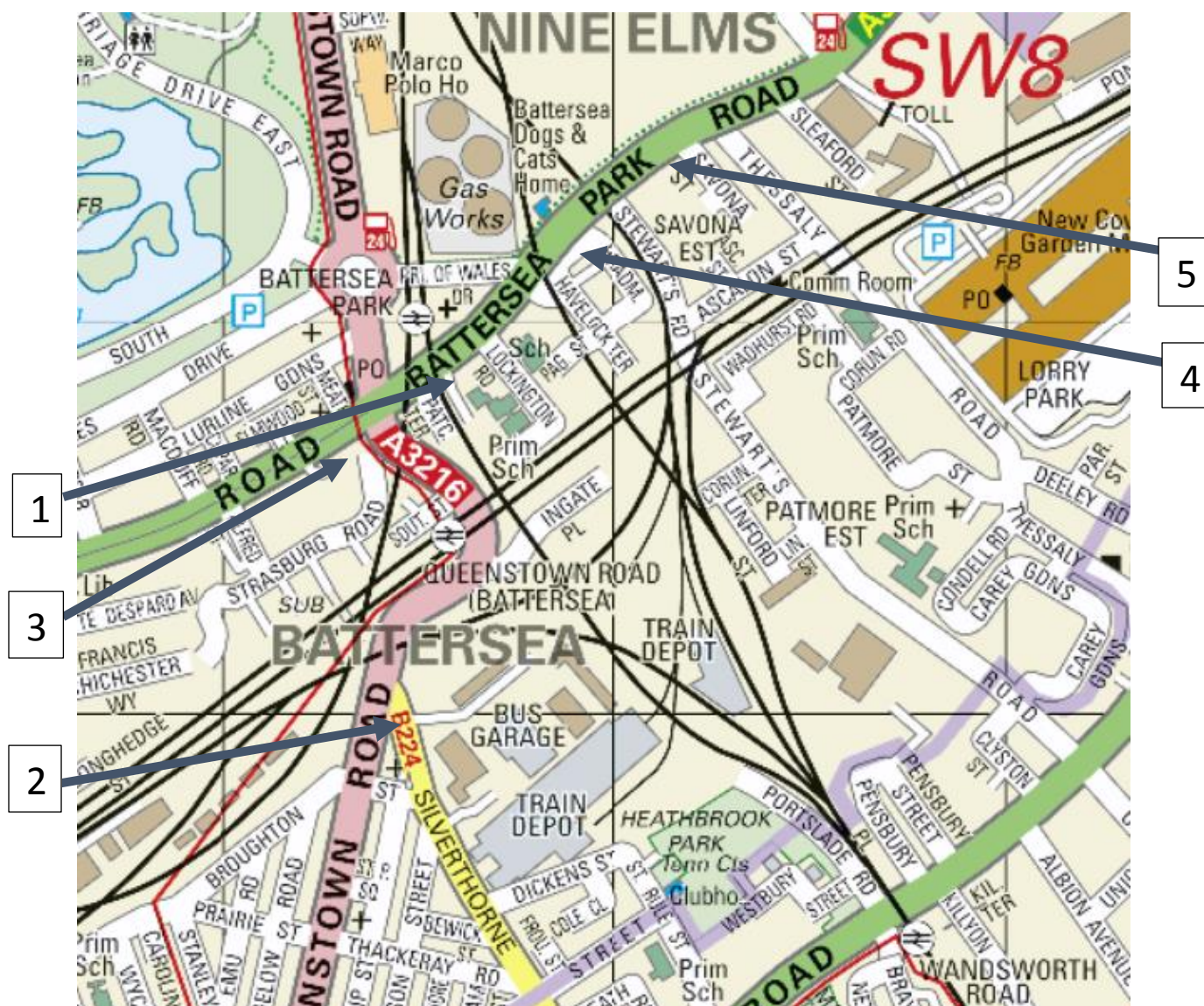


Battersea Pub Crawl

Friday 2nd May 2014



Our Monopoly themed pub crawl moves to the Electric Company square and the area around London's most famous, if now defunct, power station.

Please don't be put off by the lack of tube lines there are two over-ground stations nearby. Battersea Park station is 5 minutes from Victoria or Clapham Junction. Queenstown Road station is 5 minutes from Waterloo or Vauxhall. Return trains run until past midnight.

1. 6:00pm – 7:00pm. The Masons Arms, 169 Battersea Park Rd, London, SW8 4BT

Close to both local stations, the Masons is best described as a gastro pub. Fuller's and guest ales available. Comfy sofas but if the weather allows, there are tables outside.

2. 7:05pm – 8:05pm. Victoria, 166 Queenstown Rd, Battersea, SW8 3QH

A nice looking Fuller's pub with generally good reviews. Gastro pub again but may be an option for those looking to eat. Walls show images of the power station. Four ales on tap. Tables outside again so keep your fingers crossed for the weather.

3. 8:10pm – 9:10pm. Paya and Horse, 181 Battersea Park Rd, SW11 4LB

Apparently London's first Serbian pub. No real ales but plenty of lagers and a range of traditional Serbian spirits. Menu looks very interesting and I will almost certainly eat here.

4. 9:15pm – 10:15pm. Flanagans, 133 Battersea Park Rd, London, SW8 4AG

A much more traditional pub serving a few guest beers, and with the obvious Irish influence, possibly a good pint of Guinness.

5. 10:15pm – closing. The Duchess, 101 Battersea Park Rd, SW8 4DS

Solid Victorian pub recently dragged from keg-only obscurity into the bright lights of celebrity destination. The décor is eclectic but the views of Sir Giles Gilbert Scott's iconic Battersea Power Station are unrivalled. Guest beers are typically from Shepherd Neame and Sambrook's.
